

New High Quality Training Programmes on Integrated Drug Development Sciences/Pharmaceutical Medicine with Europe-wide Scope and Impact

- Provides new coordinated training of the entire value chain of integrated Drug Development Sciences/Pharmaceutical Medicine
- For all key players in the process of the research, development, regulation and market introduction of new medicines
- In a pan-European public-private partnership of 23 European Universities, 15 member companies of the European Federation of Pharmaceutical Industries and Associations, EFPIA, as well as 14 learned societies including competent authorities e.g. the European Medicines Agency, EMA, EuropaBio and the Drug Information Association DIA Europe
- Using shared standards based on the new PharmaTrain Syllabus 2010, adjusted learning outcomes, a modular standardised build up, a newly created PharmaTrain e-library to enrich face-to-face training or to be used for e/blended learning concept for all in Europe, an integrated examination strategy including assignments after each module, the PharmaTrain Continued and Professional Development, CPD, platform as well as a three tier quality self-management system
- Applying these standards to a Base Course (6 modules over 2 years, 30 ECTS European Credit Transfer System Points, 900 training hours as well as to a Master of Sciences in Drug Development/Pharmaceutical Medicine: for an Extension Master Programme after the Base Course (6+6 modules total 60 ECTS + Master Thesis) or an Integrated Master Programme (12 similar modules and a Master Thesis over 3 to 4 year, 1800 training hours). All in all these are 21 individual training programmes: 6 Base Courses and 13 + 2 Master Programmes at the European partner Universities; please consult their websites (overleaf!).
- These training programmes standardised and orchestrated by IMI PharmaTrain will add a new dimension to the Drug Development process by intensely training people to a new level of competency and thereby improve safety, quality, economy as well as time to patients for new medicines in Europe
